



U.S. News and World Report 2011 Undergraduate Rankings University of Georgia Results

In the 2011 *U.S. News and World Report* Undergraduate Rankings, the University of Georgia (UGA) ranks 56th among national universities together with a group of six other universities: Boston University, Fordham University (NY), Ohio State University-Columbus, Purdue University-West Lafayette (IN), Southern Methodist University (TX), and University of Maryland-College Park. Among public universities, the University of Georgia ranks 18th together with a group of three other universities: Ohio State University-Columbus, Purdue University-West Lafayette (IN), and University of Maryland-College Park.

As compared to the 2010 *U.S. News and World Report*, UGA has moved from 58th to 56th within the ranking for national universities and from 21st to 18th within the ranking for public universities. UGA was also recognized as one of the top national universities whose students have the least debt. In addition, the business program at the University of Georgia ranks 28th together with a group of five other universities: Arizona State University, Georgia Institute of Technology, Michigan State University, Texas A&M University-College Station, and University of Florida. This year's ranking represents a slight downward movement from last year's (tied for 25th) for UGA's undergraduate business program.

The *U.S. News and World Report* uses several measures for their undergraduate rankings. These fall into seven categories: peer assessment, graduation and retention rate, faculty resources, student selectivity, financial resources, alumni giving and graduation rate performance. For this year's report (2011), U.S. News has adjusted the weights of two of its categories: peer assessment and graduation rate performance. The former has been adjusted into what U.S. News has labeled as an *undergraduate academic reputation index*. This category has a weight of 22.5% of the final score and encompasses a score for peer assessment (opinions of college presidents, provosts, and deans) with a weight of 15% and a score provided by high school counselors (opinions of high school counselors concerning the schools their graduates attend) with a weight of 7.5%. The weight for the category graduation rate performance has also been adjusted from 5% (previously) to 7.5%.

UGA's 2011 ranking scores as compared to 2010 remain the same for peer assessment and have dropped for faculty resources (measured by class size, faculty salary, proportion with highest degree, and other factors) and financial resources (two-year average spending per student on instruction, research, student services, and related expenditures directed towards education only). However, these ranking scores have improved for graduation and retention, selectivity, and alumni giving. In addition, UGA's graduation rate performance has increased 1 point.

As in recent years, UGA is ranked generally near Ohio State University, University of Maryland, Purdue University, and Texas A&M. Four public institutions ranked near UGA last year fell a few spots this year: University of Pittsburgh, Clemson University, Texas A&M, and University of Minnesota. Additionally, the University of Florida fell out of the top 50, from 47 to 53.

An analysis of an eight year trend for UGA rankings, as seen in Table 3, shows that in the 2011 *U.S. News and World Report* UGA has achieved its highest national and public universities (56th and 18th respectively) ranking in eight years. The same achievement holds for the graduation and retention and selectivity rankings (52nd and 56th respectively). However, UGA's rankings for faculty resources, financial resources, and alumni giving are among the lowest as compared to previous years (74th, 115th, & 102nd respectively).

In a comparative analysis of UGA’s ranking and the rankings of UGA’s comparator peer institutions (BOR Peers), it was observed that UGA has remained 5th best in both the National and Public categories during the last 4 years (2010, 2009, 2008, and 2007) and that for the 2011 *U.S. News and World Report* it has moved to 3rd place within both of these categories together with University of Maryland-College Park and Ohio State University. Among our BOR peers, three fell several places within the National category and both University of Arizona and North Carolina State fell approximately 20 spaces. Only one peer made a significant gain: University of Missouri went up eight places.

In a comparative analysis within UGA’s Aspirational peer institutions, UGA has remained 12th out of 13 universities in the National category (Table 5) and 11th out of 12 universities in the Public category (Table 6) during the last 5 years. Two of our aspirational peers fell several places but remained in the top 50: University of Wisconsin and University of Illinois.
